Rainmakers at Balkanplus, November 14, 2015

It might seem unusual that the Rainmakers are leading Balkanplus for the first time as we started as a General International Group 39 years ago. However, when I'm asked to do something new I often say 'yes' and wonder why afterwards.

Working out a programme with Alan Trangmar (a keen Balkanplus member) has allowed me to reflect a little on our group's changing and expanding repertoire over the years. I came with a mixture of dances that I had learned in the 60s and early 70s in Cambridge – Serbian, Israeli, Hungarian, Czech, Romanian and some old SIFD staples. Roy Bowtell and Gordon Stacey, two of the cofounders, were keen on couple and set dances.

Gordon was our first treasurer and when I was teaching Serbian dancing in the early days he always made a point of going into the kitchen to do the accounts! We have included a very old recording of a Serbian dance *Sumatovac* in our programme.

Over the years we have been fortunate to have had many excellent SIFD teachers of Balkan dancing at our club at Letchworth (Lillian Gallatis, Frances Horrocks, Marina Woltstenholme, Maggie O'Regan, Frank Dowling, Nick Green and Liz Mellish, Dalila Heath as well as many equally excellent teachers of other varieties of dancing.) We have also learned from our own members, John and Sheila Robinson (from Washington, USA) who were Balkanplus members taught us *Jove Malo Mome* which will be included in our programme. We are including dances from recent Balkanplus workshops, including two dances from this September's course taught by Iliana and Todor, also Summer School dances taught by 'National' dance teachers, including a few of Marius Ursu's Romanian dances taught this year at Swansea. There will be 'something old, something new, something borrowed' but nothing blue!

Why did I say 'yes'? Because Rainmakers is a collaborative group with people contributing and we hope to continue this trend at our evening and into our 40^{th} year in 2016. So, with a little help from our friends we should share a good evening. Thank you for coming to support us.





Claire chose Ajde Jano but was unfortunately away for this evening so missed this Slavic/ Macedonian dance ('everything in threes') with a lovely song and interesting 7/8 rhythm.

Alan chose Le'or Chiyuchech (Light of Your Smile) from Israel. Janet Woolbar taught it to the Rainmakers many years ago. The essential feature of this dance is a lilting Yemenite step, with a bounce, to pretty music.

Rainmakers International Folk Dance Group celebrating 40 years!

Rainmakers are holding a 40th Anniversary Dance, on Saturday 10th September, 7.45pm to 11pm at Ickleford Village Hall, 82 Arlesey Road, Ickleford, Hitchin, SG5 3TG, and invite everyone who is interested to join us (RSVP to Roger 01438 812766 roger.lowes@ntlworld.com or Mark 01462 454210 markbalaam2@sky.com)

Rainmakers started when Jill Bransby moved to Letchworth in 1976 and met Roy and Renee Bowtell and Gordon and Dalphine Stacey. The five founder members launched Rainmakers on 10 September 1976 in Stevenage. Mayim Mayim (Water, water) was a popular dance in the early period – and the launch of the group coincided with the breaking of the long drought of that hot summer, so "Rainmakers" was the obvious name. And of course when some of the same people started a band in 1977, that became Cloudburst.

The group meets every Friday (with some exceptions – call to check), currently in St Michael's Church Hall, Broadway, Letchworth, SG6 3PQ from 8 to 10 pm, with Jill teaching most evenings. The group has taken part in over 150 displays and demos, including a regular appearance at the Hitchin Gathering as long as that took place. The club also organises excellent day courses led by teachers from the Society for International Folk Dancing (SIFD) – most recently Balkan and Israeli with Fiona Haworth, in May. The club also takes part in joint events with other dance groups eg Danse Herts French Dance group, Staplers.

All told the club has danced well over 500 different dances from four continents: lines, circles, couple dances, sets of many formations; fast and slow; easy and complicated. There are dances in the repertoire from Armenia, Bulgaria, China, Germany, Greece, Hungary, India, Italy, Japan, New Zealand, Russia, Sweden, Ukraine and more.

The club is financially self-supporting and fees are modest (£3 per evening), an encouragement to the new members who are always welcome (you do not need to come with a partner, many dances are in lines or circles and we all mix up for the partner dances).

In 1989 a riot broke out when some drunken youths gatecrashed a Rainmakers dance in Hemel Hempstead. But most memorable was the near appearance of Rainmakers on the Barrymore show. Several days of rehearsal and instruction, and then a long day of filming ended on the cutting room floor.

Rainmakers is affiliated to SIFD and periodically leads one of their Sunday evening dances in London. Jill Bransby was Chairman of SIFD (1991-95) and Claire Steeley ran the Society's shop for many years. Martin Butler, one of the leaders of the SIFD band, came to international music through Cloudburst and Rainmakers.

The London Bulgarian Choir



In November 2000, Dessislava Stefanova gathered a handful of friends and Bulgarian music enthusiasts in the Islington Arts Factory. On that night, the London Bulgarian Choir was born – but never renamed. Now, fifty-strong and thoroughly international, they have brought the traditional folk music of Bulgaria not only to concert halls and churches, but also to nightclubs, festivals, dark forests, rock concerts and even a barge on the Thames.

The Choir's notable achievements include winning the title of BBC Radio 3 Open Choir of the Year in 2006, featuring as one of Joan Armatrading's Favourite Choirs on BBC Radio 4 in 2008 and performing at Westminster Abbey in 2010. They have collaborated with numerous rock, jazz and classical musicians, most prominently with rock band Doves at the BBC Electric Proms, broadcast live on BBC 2 in October 2009, with the English Chamber Orchestra in 2011, with pop singer Sophie Ellis-Bextor in 2013 and with renowned Welsh singer Cerys Matthews in 2015. Members of the choir sang on the award-winning soundtrack of the BBC's Elizabeth, the Virgin Queen, on the movie Troy and are the voice of a long-extinct civilisation on the Microsoft X-Box game HALO 4.

The choir has released two albums, Alyana Galyana (2007) and Goro Le Goro (2012). Tours of Bulgaria in 2005, 2010 and 2015 took the choir's London-flavoured Bulgarian songs back to their spiritual homeland.

Dessislava Stefanova

Aged 5, Dessi was quite certain that singing suited her perfectly and set upon convincing the rest of the world. After a childhood spent performing with the Zagorche children's folk ensemble, she went on to become a professional singer and assistant conductor with the renowned Philip Koutev Bulgarian National Folk Ensemble.

She moved to the UK in 2000, and quickly established a reputation as a teacher and conductor of Bulgarian singing, leading workshops around the world and directing mass choral events Whispering Woods, Singing Streets and Town To Earth. She is also a soloist. Her voice can be heard lending drama to key moments in Troy, The Brothers Grimm, Elizabeth the Virgin Queen, Ghost Ship, Atlantis, Borat, Ben Hur and games HALO 4 and 5. She has toured with Balkan Beat Box, A Spell in Time and the Ricciotti Ensemble. In 2011 the Bulgarian Ministry of Foreign Affairs awarded Dessi a silver medal for her and the choir's contribution to Bulgarian culture.

Kiril Todorov

Tonight's orchestral arrangements of Bulgarian songs are by acclaimed Bulgarian composer Kiril Todorov. Although he



started his professional life as concertmaster for the Stara Zagora Opera, his passion for traditional music led him to start writing choral arrangements of the Thracian songs he had learnt from his mother in childhood. During his 50-year career as a composer, he has written over 2,000 works and directed pioneering vocal ensembles Trayana and Folk Scat, blending folk and jazz into a sublime a cappella genre. In March 2010, he was made Emeritus Professor by the Bulgarian Academy of Science in recognition of his contribution to music. He has travelled especially from Bulgaria to be here tonight!




