Betty Lee (3.6. 1933 - 13.12. 2019)

Betty and Henry joined the Rainmakers International Folk Dancing Group when it was founded in September 1976. They both became loyal and enthusiastic members, even paying their subs when they couldn't attend a meeting. When we had jumble sales to raise money, we always sorted the jumble out at their house. Betty kept our scrapbooks from 1976 - 2013, meticulously describing all our many activities, such as demonstrations, festivals, picnics, parties and workshops.

The 'Early Days' scrapbook showed Betty dancing Mayim, Mayim, Nigoono Shel Yoshi (see photo 1) and Kreuz Koenig. She took part in displays locally, including the annual Hitchin Gatherings (see photo 2 which shows Betty in a Vollendam costume.) Betty and Henry brought hats, clogs, braid and Skirt materials from Holland which we made into our costumes for our 1988 performance and on numerous future occasions.) Further afield, Betty danced at the Sidmouth Festival, Covent Garden (the market not the Opera House!) and at the Royal Albert Hall with the SIFD. We were delighted that Betty (and Henry) managed to come to Rainmakers 40th Anniversary dance in 2016. (See photo 3 which shows Betty and Henry watching the Maori Stick dance. Guess who made the paper sticks? Betty and Henry of course.)

In recent years, when Betty was housebound, she always wanted to know who was still dancing with Rainmakers and how they were. She was still interested in the wider world and remained cheerful despite her restricted circumstances. She will be sadly missed but remembered with affection.

A Chula and Doudlebskà Polka

The Rainmakers last danced 'A Chula' (Portuguese dance featured last month) at the final Hitchin Gathering in 1998. (The Gatherings had been organised for 40 years by The Staplers English Dance Club, of which I am a member.) At this final event Rainmakers performed a suite of dances called 'Portuguese Sunshine' and the music was played by Cloudburst, led by Martin Butler.



We started with Bate, Bate Ó Silva Verde, a circular dance for couples which comes from the Algarve. I learnt it from the winning Algarvean team at an Eisteddfod the previous year. We made a new set of costumes for the event. (See photo) The second dance performed was 'Fadinho A Três Tempos'. This is the three speeds

dance which comes from the Ribatejo area. Janet Woolbar taught us this couple dance which is still in our repertoire. The third dance was 'Á Chula' from Northern Portugal . I think we danced it as the instructions provided last month by Heather Edwards. We had lines of 2 couples which filled the dancing space nicely and showed the patterns of the dance well. The Bob step went forward and back



(see photo of rehearsal). The 'swish' step was hard work with a lot of turning – pivoting. The clap step a welcome relief from this and the 'Horns of the Bull' figure must have looked good from the balcony and we faced this 'presence' on each diagonal.

I can tell you all this

because Rainmakers have scrapbooks (predating Facebook!) detailing every event that they have undertaken from 1976 up until the present day. Betty Lee meticulously kept them from 1976 until 2013. We also have DVDs (updated from videos) of displays including the one described above.

Our group is much smaller and just a bit (!) older now but we sometimes still dance Doudlebskà Polka (to be featured this month) and all of our men can still reach the

floor on the 3rd part ('hands, hands, side, side, hands, hands, knees, knees, hands, hands, **floor**, **floor**, hands, hands....' It's a good party dance and even suitable for barn dances (with Cloudburst), although 'normal' non dancing folks struggle with the first polka figure – sometimes they walk about or gallop round the room.

Thank you for reminding us of these dances and happy days dancing them.

Rainmakers 2020 - What we were doing

We started a Farewell to Europe in January at each meeting by doing a dance from a European country that we would be leaving. We managed 6 countries so I think that's another 21 to go. This is apolitical but seemed a good opportunity to remind ourselves of dances we used to do and perhaps research dances to expand our knowledge.

Meryl Abraham visited the Rainmakers on March 6th to teach us: Xanime (Kurdish), Dodi Li (Israel), Tea Pickers' Dance (Taiwan), Hora Pe Sase (Romania), W Moin Ogródecku (Poland), Zenska Albanska Igra (Albania). We enjoyed these and vowed to dance them soon to get them into our repertoire. Thank you Meryl (and David) for an interesting and varied evening, and thank you to the SIFD for your support of such events. I think it's a brilliant way of sharing repertoires and connecting with other groups.

The following Friday 13th we managed to do the first 2 dances but the rest of the evening was spent preparing and reminding ourselves of dances that were to be on The Balkan Plus programme that we were leading in London the next day. Peter and I also had a young Japanese relative Mizuki Iwasaki staying with us, who showed us some very energetic Japanese dancing that evening. Mizuki also performs in a traditional Folk Dance troupe that performs Bon Odori. She repeated the energetic dancing at B+ and managed to dance most of our Balkan programme including Charachan Odori!

What we are not doing now or are trying to do Since Lockdown we have tried to do a dance at 8 pm on Friday night in our own houses. Music and instructions have been sent out in advance. So far we have tried Ma Na'Vu (because it's easy), Hora Hadera (because it's fun), Syen Tu (because there was a Supermoon that week) and Changerai-tu? (because it was requested, but also because the words of the song reinforce ideas of social isolation, Madeleine doesn't join the man and his sheep at his home!).

What we hope to do - Our 44th Anniversary Dance is scheduled for 16th October, with Cloudburst playing. We have another SIFD guest teacher, Ursula Brown, coming to Rainmakers in November.

I do hope you are all keeping safe, sane and well and 'hope we meet again some sunny day'! Keep dancing (even if only virtually).

In answer to Dorothy Sloan's Letter in the April News.

The Volendam costumes that the Rainmakers made in 1982/3, from the materials that Betty and Henry Lee brought back from Holland, were based on those we saw at the Sidmouth Folk Festival in 1981 when the Dansgroep Paloina, from Amsterdam, were performing. I have three photos that Henry took of the group showing how they made an entrance in clogs but then danced in their shoes. This is what we also did when we first performed a Dutch Suite at the Hitchin Gathering in 1983, and at various other events, including a Dutch wedding, and at a Dutch plant Nursery. We did our best to capture the dance style and sequences from watching various Dutch teams over the years.

Our other reference point for the costumes was the very useful and delightful book Folk Costumes of the World written by Robert Harrold, a fellow of the Imperial Society for Teacher of Dancing. Plate 7, which is copyright so not included here, shows a couple in the same Volendam costume. I expect quite a few SIFD members have this book on their shelves anyway.

I am sorry that Dorothy disapproved of our costumes but thought I'd explain that we researched them from what we thought were two reliable sources and that we, and we hope, our audiences enjoyed our displays.

I recollect that you had to make more or less a full turn of 360 degrees on one (right) foot, on a single beat, (without toppling over). How the lady in the man's arms managed to get round him, I have now not a slightest idea. I have a vague memory of attempting the enben turn a few times afterwards, without any visible success, before accepting defeat.

One-legged dances seem to be a Scandinavian speciality.

I have (yesterday) discovered the BEST way to share recorded sound on Zoom: which doesn't seem to exist on Webex. You do Share Screen and select the Advanced tab, that has an option to "share sound only". Problem solved, it will give the good sound, should be much better than using the Coomber, without (I hope) changing anyone's screen display. (I am not 100% certain that option exists if I am not the meeting host; I believe co-hosts are possible but that might be a paid-for option, not sure)

So if you can now connect to Zoom, that's the better option. I have been finding that Zoom often extends the 40 minutes; but if not, the cost/month is less than room hire (though I guess hard to collect weekly subs remotely).



More disasters!

I can relate very closely to some of Fiona's disaster stories and she even included a Reel to Reel tape recorder one.

In April 1976 I was dancing in a dance competition in Cambridge with a student called Nick Hunn. Kathy Tribe had entered us in it. We were using a Reel to Reel Tape recorder. We turned it on and danced onto the stage making our grand entry. Unfortunately the tape got caught up in the machine but we continued dancing Czardas Myjava. The judges told us to stop and we could start again. We dashed off stage, found a nail file in my handbag and proceeded to undo the machine and untwist the tape and rewind it to start again. We danced again in fear and trepidation that the same thing would happen but it didn't and we managed to dance without further mishap. No, we didn't win the competition.

Some music equipment mishaps are easier to rectify, such as when the Rainmakers danced at Ramsey Abbey Festival in 1984. We were dancing outside of a building with our Tape recorder plugged in through a window. We were in mid dance performing 'A Gota' when the sound abruptly stooped. We continued to sing the tune and finish the dance which produced much applause from the audience. I managed to get back in the building and discovered that someone had unplugged our tape recorder to put the kettle on!

A costuming disaster happened to me at the 1981 Hitchin Gathering. The sequence consisted of Italian dances when Henry Lee and I were partners for the second dance La Danza. At the end of the dance there was a lift and, as I bent my knees in preparation to jump up/be lifted in the air, Henry trod on the bottom of my long Sicilian skirt. As I rose in the air I heard a sickening ripping sound which was the gathers of the skirt ripping out of the waist band. I gathered up the yards of skirting material, thrust it down the front of my waist band as I ran into position for the next dance which was Tarantella Montevirgene. Holding hands in the circle of four was an act of faith because I couldn't hold the material. Somehow I got through the dance and most of the audience were unaware of the traumas going on except for some of Isobel Lamont's Scottish dance friends who saw the expression on my face when the skirt ripped.

Fiona also mentioned getting caught up in a net, so here's a miniature net story. In 1990 Rainmakers were performing a sequence of four dances at the annual Hitchin Gathering. Our 6 minute sequence for that occasion was called 'Walking in Europe' and we had borrowed some costumes from the SIFD for the Swiss dance 'En Allant aux Chataignes'. Betty's words in our Raimakers' scrapbook take up the story. 'This is a bright lively dance involving a lot of turning. When Peter (Bransby) was turning Maria (Kerr) his finger became caught in her net glove. As she turned the cotton wound tighter and tighter round his finger until it was losing it's circulation! She frantically tried to pull off the glove but had to tear it to release him!' This was just in time for them to get into a new formation to perform the final dance of the sequence and save Peter's finger!

Peter reminds me of more dramatic disasters - that we danced through a riot in Hemel Hempstead and we ended up on the cutting room floor when danced with Barrymore

but that's enough of my disaster stories for the June News. I'm sure other groups have plenty of their own! Now we only have to worry about whether our Zoom meeting will stop in mid dance when we meet online. How sad is that?

Curbs may be last straw for many pubs and restaurants, warn industry groups

New lockdown restrictions to be imposed across much of England from tomorrow could be the "death knell" for many pubs and restaurants, the government has been warned, as business groups voiced fears of a wave of job losses within weeks.

Essex, York and parts of Derbyshire, as well as London, are among the regions subject to tougher tier-2 curbs, meaning people from multiple households will not be allowed to mix in venues such as pubs and

restaurants. Almost a third of restaurants in England - about 8,500 venues - and more than 5,000 pubs, or around in seven, will be affected by the measures announced yesterday, according to the property adviser Altus Group.

"Further restrictive measures that adversely impact trade, already at far lower levels than before the pandemic, without any discerning targeted support, could be the death knell," said Robert Hayton of Altus.

The hospitality trade has already suffered a plunge in sales in the wake of restrictions including the lopm curfew and the "rule of six", which have helped reduce town and city centre

footfall. Pubs and bars that serve little or no food have suffered the most because they have not benefited from the "eat out to help out" scheme or a temporary VAT cut on food.

The head of the trade body UKHospitality, Kate Nicholls, said the new measures were the "worst of both worlds" because they would hurt trade but did not come with the financial

The number of jobs at risk without a bailout for the hospitality sector, according to business leaders

support available in areas designated tier 3, where pubs and bars must close utiless they serve substantial meals.

The organisation fears London venues will be particularly badly affected because they are already reeling from the loss of trade from tourists and office workers. "A move into tier 2 will now be catastrophic for some of them and it is only going to be made worse by the end of the furlough scheme in under two weeks," said Nicholls.

Hospitality bosses have previously warned that 300,000 jobs could be lost without a sector-specific bailout.

Nicholls called on the government to provide a financial safety net by allowing hospitality firms to waive contributions to the "job support scheme" - which requires companies to pay 55% of an employee's monthly wages - or by giving them the same support available in tier-3 regions, which includes covering two-thirds of the pay for workers in companies forced to close by the restrictions.

"If it [the government] does not, we are looking at catastrophic business closures and widespread job losses in the capital as early as 1 November," Nicholls said.

The chief executive of the British Beer and Pub Association, Emma McClarkin, called on the government to "do the right thing" by announcing targeted financial support, saying permanent closures would be unavoidable without it.

Groups focused on the capital's prosperity urged the government to ensure the measures could be lifted as soon as possible. Jasmine Whitbread, the chief executive of London First.

Outrage at tier 3 'talks'

Fury unites Tories and Labour in north-west

ndy Burnham woke up yesterday resigned to the fact he had probably failed. For the past week the Greater Manchester mayor had been doing his best to stop the government from imposing tighter restrictions on his 2.8 million constituents, who had already been banned from socialising indoors since the end of July.

Then a leak to journalists seemed to confirm he had lost. Yesterday's Times splashed with "Millions facing new lockdown." It claimed Greater Manchester and Lancashire would be placed in the "very high" tier 3 category alongside the Liverpool region, prompting the closure of all drinking establishments.

London, meanwhile, would be pushed into tier 2, subjecting 9 million residents of the capital to pretty much the same restrictions much of the north had been under since the summer.

But while the capital's mayor, Sadiq Khan, approved the change for London, the same could not be said of the leaders and MPs in Greater Manchester and Lancashire.

A series of calls were planned for yesterday morning, ostensibly to get them to agree to the imposition



of tier 3, before Matt Hancock's statement in the Commons at 11,30am. They did not go to plan.

Burnham, along with Greater Manchester's 10 local authority leaders, went first, in a call at 10am. Sean Fielding, the 30-year-old leader of Oldham council, described how

Sir Ed Lister, the prime minister's strategic adviser, "had clearly been sent to tell us we were going in tier 3, but he bottled it because he got so much pushback".

Nothing at all was offered to bring the leaders onside, said Fielding, despite their having sent ahead a list of demands, including upping the hospitality furlough to 80% and more support for local test and trace. "It ended with Lister saying: 'OK, we will take that away, but don't expect us to come back with anything.' So what was the bloody point of the meeting?" asked Fielding.

Saying no to a group of Labour leaders may not be difficult for the government, but Greater Manchester's sole Tory leader -Bolton's David Greenhalgh - was among them and was one of "the most vocal", said Fielding. "He's against tier 3 because he had all the pubs close in Bolton and saw the damage it caused and how it didn't get the infections down. The only thing he isn't in favour of, which we are, is a national circuit breaker."

The leaders had been galvanised by a conversation the previous night with Jonathan Van-Tam, the deputy chief medical officer. He had said that "to bring the infection rates down, any regional lockdown would require widespread closures, way beyond pubs, to stand any real chance of working, and that would have to be done in tandem with other neighbouring regions, and even then it would not be certain to work", Burnham told reporters

yesterday afternoon. Fielding said: "We were saying to Ed Lister: 'Why do you want us to agree to something your own medical adviser thinks won't work?' And he couldn't answer."

But it was on the next call, with Greater Manchester's MPs and the care minister, Helen Whately, that things got really uncomfortable. Nine of the region's 27 constituencies are now Conservative, including Burnham's own "red wall" seat of Leigh. Before the call, the Labour MPs agreed they would let the Conservatives go first.

The three-tier system

What the new alert levels and restrictions mean

The government's new rules have created a three-tier system with increasing restrictions depending on the designated alert level. Here is a summary of the main rules.


- The "rule of six" applies, meaning socialising in groups of more than six people is prohibited whether indoors or outdoors.
- Tradespeople can go into a household for work and are not part of the six-person limit.
- Businesses and venues can operate but pubs and restaurants must ensure customers only consume food and drink while seated, and close between 10pm
- Takeaway food can be sold after 10pm if ordered by phone or online.
- Schools and universities remain open.
- Places of worship remain open but people must not mingle in a group of more than six.
- Weddings and funerals can go ahead with restrictions on the number of people who can attend (15 and 30 respectively).

 Exercise classes and organised sport can continue to take place outdoors, and - if the rule of six is followed - indoors.

- No socialising with anybody outside the household or support bubble in any indoor setting.
- The rule of six continues to apply for socialising outdoors, including in a garden or public space such as a park or beach.
- Tradespeople can continue to go into a household for work.
- Same rules as for tier 1 for businesses, venues, pubs and restaurants, takeaway food, schools and universities, places of worship, and weddings and funerals.
- Exercise classes and organised sport can continue to take place outdoors but will only be permitted indoors if it is possible for people to avoid mixing with those they do not live with (or share a support bubble with), or for youth or disability sport.
- Travel is allowed to amenities that are open, for work or to access education, but the advice is to reduce number of journeys where

not live with, or have not formed a support bubble with, in any indoor setting, private garden or at most outdoor hospitality venues and ticketed events.

Tradespeople can continue to go

into a household for work.

The rule of six continues to apply to outdoor public spaces, including

beaches or sports venues.

Pubs and bars can only remain open to operate as restaurants, and alcohol can only be served as part of a substantial meal.

Schools and universities remain

 Places of worship remain open but household mixing is not permitted.

 Weddings and funerals can go ahead with restrictions on the number of people attending (15 and 30 respectively) but wedding receptions are not allowed.

Organised sport can take place outdoors but will only be permitted indoors if it is possible for people to avoid mixing with people they do not live with, or for youth or disability sport. However, in Merseyside, gyms were ordered to close when it entered tier 3.

 Travelling outside a very high alert level area or entering such an area should be avoided other than for purposes such as work, education or youth services, to meet caring responsibilities or if travelling through as part of a longer journey.

Residents of a tier 3 area should avoid staying overnight in another part of the UK, while people who live in a tier 1 or tier 2 area should avoid staying overnight in a very high alert level area.

Regional differences

Capital is suffering, but why is it behind the north?

oronavirus infections are rising across the country, but until recently it was the northern cities that seemed to be igniting like powder kegs, while London was smouldering but not catching fire.

But the announcement that second tier restrictions will be imposed on the capital from midnight tonight heralds the possibility that Londoners won't be spared a second wave. Infection rates in 12 boroughs already exceed 100 cases per 100,000, with Richmond upon Thames topping the

But what will London's second wave look like if it comes? Some scientists have suggested former hotspots may be less affected second time around due to higher rates of immunity, or altered behaviour patterns. Here are some of the leading theories about differences in regional Covid-19 infection rates:

Herd immunity

The herd immunity level for Covid-19 is estimated at 60% of a population, and the latest Public Health England data suggest only 17.5% of Londoners have antibodies. It's possible some people have T cell immunity, which can build up independently of antibodies. It's also possible some pockets of London have a higher prevalence of antibodies than others, but this is still unlikely to hit required levels. "My reading tells me herd immunity cannot be achieved without a vaccine," said Prof David Alexander at the Institute for Risk and Disaster Reduction at UCL.

More people working from home London has large numbers of whitecollar workers, and a relatively low number of people working in manufacturing, retail and wholesale, relative to other areas of the country. Many white-collar workers can work remotely. There's also far less mixing

taking place on public transport. An analysis of people's activity patterns by Prof James Cheshire, a professor of geographic information and cartography at UCL, and his colleagues suggested Londoners are still making significantly fewer journeys into central London than they were before lockdown, whereas other cities were getting closer to normality. "I think the interesting question for London is whether the mixing that's going on in households is what's driving the current increase in cases we're seeing," Prof Cheshire said. If it is, then tier 2 restrictions, which prohibit indoor socialising, could have a significant impact.

Londoners more cautious about socialising

Although compliance with social

distancing guidelines was initially high in the UK, it's possible Londoners were so traumatised by high infection rates in the spring they're now more cautious about visiting public spaces. Anonymised data collected by Google suggest that, compared to January 2020, visits to public venues are down 30% and 31% in Merseyside and Greater Manchester whereas in Greater London they have fallen by 39%.

Isle of Wight

Higher deprivation in the north More than half of Birmingham's and Manchester's worst-hit areas are among the poorest in England, while in Liverpool it is closer to two-thirds. It's established that people in poor areas are more likely to be exposed to SARS-CoV-2 in the first place. "Those with lower-paid

and public-facing occupations are often classified as essential workers who must work outside the home and may travel to work on public transport," says Dr Muge Cevik, a virologist at the University of St Andrews. Job and financial insecurities may also make them less inclined to comply with restrictions, while overcrowded households can make it harder to self-isolate.

London also has pockets of extreme deprivation and overcrowding. "However, the nature of the jobs there, and the nature of the wealth there for some people, has meant London has been able to adapt differently to other areas," says Prof Richard Harris, professor of quantitative social geography at the University of Bristol. Whether this will be enough to buffer it against the full brunt of a second wave is unclear. "Things are in their favour, but I don't think we can take it for granted," Prof Harris says. "There are people who are just as vulnerable in London as there are in other cities.

The timing of lifting restrictions Another possibility is that infection rates in northern towns and cities were never driven as low as they were in London and the south, so once those restrictions were relaxed, these "embers" reignited in the north. An analysis by Public Health England found that some areas of Manchester, Bolton, Oldham and Rochdale never really left the epidemic phase.

Minutes of AGM held at 8.01pm on 20th August 2021 at St Thomas Church Hall, Bedford Road, Letchworth

1 Welcome and opening remarks

Belinda welcomed those attending. Thirteen members attended. Their names were recorded and a quorum was present. Belinda reminded members that this AGM was postponed from Autumn 2020 due to Covid.

2 Apologies for absence

Apologies were received from Maria, Bev, Phil and Daksha.

3 Minutes of last AGM held on 29th November 2019

The minutes were accepted unanimously.

4 Matters arising

4.1 Min 10c: Belinda said that this would be covered later.

5 Chairman's Remarks and Report on the Year

Belinda listed the Club events which had taken place prior to the first Covid lockdown in March 2020. Also listed were those events that had been cancelled.

The Club last danced in St Michael's Church Hall on 13th March 2020 and started dancing online via Skype and then Zoom by the end of March 2020. Belinda thanked Jill and Peter for organising the online dancing on Friday evenings. Dancing on Sunday mornings on Gosmore Green started in July 2020 and is still ongoing.

Betty Lee died on 13th December 2019.

6 Treasurer's Report

Patti presented the Accounts for the year and asked if anyone had any questions.

Alan asked if the hall hire cost had gone down due to Covid. Patti confirmed that this was the case. Graham asked how the Club received a donation of 50p. Patti explained that this was due to discrepancies in weekly cash takings on Friday evenings.

Peter proposed acceptance of the Accounts. Alan seconded and the Accounts were accepted unanimously.

7 Subscriptions

Patti said that membership had been extended due to Covid, so we have not asked anyone for subscriptions in January 2021. Anyone who had paid between December 2019 and March 2020 are still members. The next subscription would now be due in January 2022.

Patti recommended that the annual subscriptions remain at £5.00 and the weekly subscriptions remain at £4.00. Alan said that it was difficult to decide on that recommendation in advance of the discussion on whether or not to return to dancing indoors. Belinda said that there should be another AGM in the Autumn, when subscription levels could be revisited prior to January 2022.

Belinda asked if anyone objected to Patti's recommendation. There were no objections.

8 Appointment of Independent Examiner

Belinda asked Roger if he was happy to continue as the independent examiner, which he was willing to do. Roger was appointed independent examiner.

9 Election of New Committee

Belinda said that she did not intend to stand again as chairman. An email had been sent to members during lockdown, asking if they were happy for the committee to continue in post until an AGM could be held.

Alan was asked if he was prepared to stand again on the Committee. Alan said that he would.

The nomination sheet was then filled in as follows:

Belinda asked if anyone else would be prepared to join the Committee.

Belinda proposed the voting of the new Committee en masse. The new Committee nominations were agreed unanimously. Belinda said that in Maria's absence she would continue to chair the meeting.

10 Dancing Indoors

Belinda said that we have to decide if we want to return to dancing inside and, if so, when. This is further complicated because currently St Michael's Hall is not available for hire, but may be at a later date. St Thomas Hall is available for hire on Friday evenings and that is why it had been chosen for the AGM.

A majority of members were happy to start dancing indoors from September. Belinda had found information on the Morris dancers' website regarding an increased risk of the creation of droplets during dancing and ways of reducing this risk, which included wearing of masks. There was then discussion about wearing masks when dancing. Alan had suggested the possibility of taking lateral flow tests as an alternative to masks. There was some discussion about lateral flow tests. Mark also said that, having done a lot of research on different availability, some halls are requiring hirers to comply with their risk assessment.

There was some discussion about what other groups are doing. Graham asked what the hiring requirements were for St Thomas Hall. Patti said that she had only seen the booking form that evening. Mark said that there were signs up outside and inside the hall.

There was some discussion as to the suitability of St Thomas Hall for dancing. It was decided that at the end of the AGM the members present would stand socially distanced to see if there was sufficient space to form a circle.

Jill asked if we have access to the cupboard at St Michael's Hall. Belinda said that we had not been asked to remove any items, so we will carry on storing items there until we hear otherwise. Jill said that there were some leads for using the Coomber with other devices. Peter asked when we would find out what will happen with St Michael's Hall. Mark said that we are waiting for the Church of England to make a decision in September.

All but two members present would be prepared to wear a mask when dancing. Jill made the point that she can't hear when people wear masks. Belinda said that a possible compromise would be what is happening with choirs where an activity takes place for 45 minutes and then the hall is emptied for 15 minutes to allow the dispersal of droplets. Peter asked if wearing a mask meant that we could hold hands or swing with people from outside our own household. Belinda said that the advice was still to maintain social distancing.

Mark made the point that he is clinically extremely vulnerable and therefore if people decided not to wear masks he might not be able to attend.

Belinda concluded by saying that the new committee will need to make a decision.

11 Betty Lee's Bequest to Rainmakers

Belinda said that Betty had mentioned Rainmakers in her will and that the bequest would possibly be a substantial amount. Patti said that the bequest would be 1% of the residuary estate. Mark said that the total value of the estate amounts to £2.9 million.

Belinda mentioned that Mark and Patti had suggested that a use for some of the money would be converting the Club scrapbooks to a digital format, especially as Betty had put a lot of work into them over the years. This would also make the scrapbooks available to everybody. Another suggestion was the purchase of new audio equipment. A memorial dance in memory of Betty & Henry could be held.

Belinda's suggestion was that we could make weekly attendance free for all members for possibly a year, so that all members gained some benefit from the bequest. Belinda did clarify that these were only suggestions as we do not know how much money we will finally receive or when. Belinda asked if anyone had any other suggestions, either now or later. Belinda said that it is highly likely that even if we did all of these suggestions there would still be a substantial amount of money left. Therefore a donation to Garden House Hospice or the hospice that looked after Betty, or both, were worth considering.

Patti said that she had recently been in touch with the solicitor dealing with the bequest but had had no reply. She said that she would update the members when she has more information.

Jill mentioned that she had read an article about other groups in the St Albans area digitalising their archives. She could not remember the details but would try and find the article.

Jill also said that this September is the 45th Anniversary of Rainmakers and it would be nice to have an Anniversary Dance, possibly at a bigger venue where we could invite former teachers and former members. The SIFD Dance around the World event has been cancelled and therefore Cloudburst would be available in October. Jill was unsure as to when any Anniversary Dance could take place.

12 Any other Business

- a) Jill said that probably not everyone had heard that Claire had fallen at home and broken her hip. However, she was now back at home.
- b) Jill mentioned that Jean Hewitt is having a birthday celebration on Sunday 12th September at Gosmore Green, between 11am and 1pm.
- c) Jill said that she and Peter would hope to be away in Portugal for 24th September and the 1st and 8th October. Other people would need to take those evenings.
- d) Mark said that he had done further research into the replacement for the Coomber. He had revisited a Coomber product that was designed for schools that interfaced with a tablet computer. This had previously been discounted due to cost. However, Coomber have stopped producing this product. Mark said that he felt that the best way forward would be to buy a tablet computer to hold the whole of the Club's archives and also to buy a portable speaker to use with it.

Alan questioned the need for a tablet computer rather than individuals using their own phones. There was some discussion. Mark also made the point that we have quite a large amount of money in our existing equipment fund and the purchase of these items would not dramatically reduce the fund. He also said that the tablet would give us functionalities that could make Friday evenings easier — an example would be to have a pre-set programme of regularly-danced dances that could be used if no dance leader was available. Bob questioned as to whether a tablet would be used.

Belinda suggested investigating costs and, if they weren't significant, she felt that a tablet would be a good idea.

- e) Belinda asked the new Committee to consider revising the Club's existing constitution with regard to the winding up of the Club, as it currently states that any residual Club funds will be paid to the SIFD. Considering that, at some stage, we might have a considerable sum in the Club's funds, Belinda suggested changing this to giving the funds to a hospice. This change could only take place at the next AGM or an EGM. There was some discussion about this. Graham asked that, if it was amended did it have to list a specific beneficiary. Peter made the suggestion that it could just state that it has to go to a charity.
- f) Patti proposed a vote of thanks to Belinda for chairing the Club and to Roger for examining the accounts. Jill thanked Patti and Mark.
- g) Jill said that she assumed that we would continue on Gosmore Green on Sunday mornings until such time that we feel like stopping. Belinda said that if Jill was willing to continue it seemed like a good idea. Peter said that there is no administration required.
- h) There being no other business, Belinda closed the meeting at 9.04pm.

Minutes of AGM held at 8.02pm on 10th December 2021 at St Thomas' Church Hall, Bedford Road, Letchworth

1 Welcome and opening remarks

Maria welcomed those attending. Thirteen members attended. Their names were recorded and a quorum was present. Maria reminded members that this AGM was for 2021.

2 Apologies for absence

Apologies were received from Graham.

3 Minutes of last AGM held on 20th August 2021

The minutes were accepted unanimously.

4 Matters arising

- 4.1 Min 7: Subscriptions Maria said that this would be covered later.
- 4.2a Min 10: Dancing Indoors Maria said that Graham had asked if the Hall had any particular hire requirements with regard to Covid. Mark has looked into this and there are no special requirements.
- 4.2b Jill had asked if we had access to the cupboards at St Michael's Hall. Maria said that the cupboards have been emptied and sorted. Sweatshirts have been offered to members and they have all gone. Jill is storing equipment to do with dancing.
- **4.2c** Belinda had said that the new committee would have to make a decision about dancing at St Thomas' Hall this has been done and we are dancing here.
- 4.3a Min 11: Betty Lee's bequest to Rainmakers Maria said that this would be dealt with later.
- 4.3b The anniversary dance has not taken place due to Covid Maria said that hopefully things will settle down next year and we will be able to hold the dance earlier rather than later.
- 4.4 Min 12d: Coomber Maria said that the replacement for the Coomber is something the committee have been looking into and is still ongoing.
- 4.5 Min 12e: Belinda had suggested changing the Club's constitution and this would be covered under Agenda item 10 at this meeting.

6 Chairman's Remarks and Report on the Year

Maria said that it had been another year with not much to report.

Dancing on Gosmore Green had started in July 2020, but we had to have a break over Christmas due to Covid and then started again on 4th April 2021. This will hopefully continue over the Winter and into next year.

Maria said that dancing indoors had re-commenced, at St Thomas' Hall, on 3rd September this year,

which strictly speaking was not in the year covered by this AGM. This seems to be going well.

The nearest thing to an event was the request evening last Friday for Diana's 80th birthday. This was an evening that included some of Diana's favourite dances.

Maria said that it was great to be dancing indoors again and also dancing outside.

6 Treasurer's Report

Patti presented the Accounts for the year and asked if anyone had any questions.

Alan asked to be reminded of the cost of hiring St Michael's Hall for a normal year. Patti said that this was approximately £1000 for 2019 (the last full year of hire), but that was when the hall cost was £36 per evening and we are now only paying £24 per night.

Belinda proposed acceptance of the Accounts. Bob seconded and the Accounts were accepted unanimously.

7 Subscriptions

Maria said that this had been brought up at the last AGM and it had been left to this AGM to set the subscription levels for January 2022. Maria said that there had been a suggestion by Belinda at the last AGM that we could use part of Betty's bequest to make weekly attendance free for all members for possibly a year, so that all members gained some benefit from the bequest. Maria said that the committee have looked into this and it would mean that the Club would lose any excess of income from Friday nights. Maria said that this proposal would cost approximately £1000.

Patti said that we have so far received £15,438, which is 70% of the final bequest. The remaining amount would be paid once an overpayment of inheritance tax had been received from the Government. Maria said that we would re-start charging annual subscriptions in January. Patti said that Belinda's proposal benefits all members. Mark said that as an when we can put on any specific events there would be a charge to cover the cost of the event. An example would be band hire. So the proposal would only cover normal Friday nights. Maria said that another example would be if we had a visiting teacher. There was further discussion. Claire asked if Betty's money should be used for replacing the Coomber. Maria said that we already had sufficient funds within the Club's equipment fund (£1200) to pay for this.

The proposal was put to a vote and a majority were in favour. Maria said that we will still continue with the same Annual subscription.

8 Appointment of Independent Examiner

Maria had asked Roger if he was happy to continue as the independent examiner, which he was willing to do. Roger was appointed independent examiner.

9 Election of New Committee

Maria asked if there was anyone who wished to stand as an officer or a member of the committee. Alan suggested that Peter or Jill should be on the committee. Maria asked Jill and Peter if either of them would be willing to stand. Jill said that she did not feel it would be necessary for her to be on the committee. Peter said that if members thought it was useful he would be willing to serve. Maria said that she felt it was good that the committee could ask any members for advice on specific subjects. Alan said that he felt that Jill should be copied in to all committee emails. There was further discussion and it was decided that Jill is happy to be involved in specific events/projects but did not wish to be on the committee. Peter suggested that Jill be an ex officio member of the committee.

This amendment was voted through unanimousy.

Maria said that the third amendment had come about in light of Betty's bequest.

Current wording: Under 'Winding up':- The Club may be wound up at a general meeting. Its assets shall be realised and after all outstanding liabilities have been met the remainder shall be donated to the Society.

Proposed wording: The Club may be wound up at a general meeting. The Club's assets shall be realised and after all outstanding liabilities have been met the remainder shall be donated to a charity or charities to be decided by that general meeting.

This amendment was voted through unanimously.

11 Any other Business

a) Maria said that in relation to Betty's bequest, we have dealt with using some of the money towards not charging for weekly attendance. Maria suggested that members might like some time to think about what we can do with the remainder of the money. A sheet was provided for members to write their suggestions. These could also be emailed to the committee.

We will email those members who were not present at the AGM for their suggestions. Maria said that we will do what the membership want us to do. The committee would investigate the costings and feasibility of any suggestions.

Maria said that next year we should form a sub-committee for this purpose. There was some discussion about involving the wider community. Maria said that the committee would report back to the members. Some ideas might not be feasible at the moment because of Covid, but could be organised in the future.

Maria said that Patti has opened a savings account for the Club to keep the bequest money separate from the Club's current account.

b) Maria said that, having been wardrobe mistress, she has a large selection of costumes which belong to the Club. She asked if she has the members' permission to look into the disposal of them. She also asked if any members would like any of the costumes. Jill said that she has Betty and Henry's costumes, plus a big bag of hats. Jill said that she would speak to the SIFD and see if they would want any of the costumes.

Alan asked if there were mainly women's costumes. Maria said that there were some men's costumes. Alan asked if photos could be taken of the men's costumes. Maria has some of Sue & Adrian's costumes and possibly some of Roy's and Terry's.

c) Maria asked if we wanted to make our usual donations to Garden House Hospice in lieu of

Christmas cards. It was agreed that we would do this. Patti said that payments could be done either by cheque or cash next week or by bank transfer. Patti would email members with details.

- d) Maria said that an email had been sent out inviting members to have lunch after dancing this Sunday at Gosmore Green. There was some discussion and it was decided to do this on the following Sunday as well.
- e) Mark asked if people wanted the committee to look into renewing the licence for dancing on Gosmore Green, which had previously cost £25 per year and runs out in April 2022, as previously this took some time to sort out. It was decided unanimously that we should re-apply for the licence. Maria said that the Club were in the Gosmore newsletter with some nice photographs. Jill said that she has put a copy in the scrapbook.
- f) Jill thanked all the committee for their hard work, particularly Mark for finding the hall and getting all the stuff out of the cupboard. She thanked Patti for her work on the Accounts.
- g) Alan said that he has looked at the tapes and books that were in the cupboard in St Michael's Hall. He felt that the tapes were redundant. There are several SIFD dance instruction booklets. Alan said that these included dances that he did not have instructions for. They are mainly for Western European dances and would be available to anyone else who would be interested in them.
- h) Maria thanked Jill for running Friday evenings and Gosmore, Alan for helping with Friday evenings and Gosmore and to Mark and Patti for keeping everything running. She also thanked the members for turning up and dancing, both indoors and outdoors.

There being no other business, Maria closed the meeting at 8.48pm.






